Instructor office hours. Faculty and graduate students who are instructors of record may hold office hours in person or remotely, at their discretion. Office hour locations/modes for TAs and others who are working under the supervision of an instructor of record should be planned in concertwith the instructor of record, so that everyone engaged nteaching the classis aware of office hour plans. Please make the mode/location of office hours clear in the class syllabus. Undergraduate advising.
